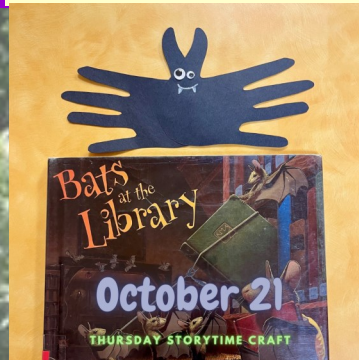

**The Municipal Election is Tuesday, November 2, 2021
from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm. Please see below for important information
on voting in the City of Laconia!**

How do I register to vote?

To register to vote in the City of Laconia, you will need to provide proof of identify (driver's license), proof of domicile (piece of mail showing name and physical address) and proof of citizenship (birth certificate, passport, or naturalization papers). If you do not have proof of domicile and/or citizenship, there is an affidavit you can sign when registering to vote.

City Hall is open from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday-Friday. The last day to register to vote in the City Clerk's office is Tuesday, October 26th. The Supervisors of the Checklist will meet that day between 7 pm and 7:30 pm in the City Clerk's Office for the purpose of making corrections/changes to the checklist. Registrations and changes will be accepted at this session; no changes will be accepted after this session.

How do I request an absentee ballot?

Please request your absentee ballot as soon as possible by contacting the City Clerk's office (603) 527-1265), by clicking [here](#) to fill out an application, or visiting City Hall to obtain an application. Completed applications can be dropped off at the City Clerk's Office (Laconia City Hall, 45 Beacon St. East), faxed to (603) 524-1766, mailed to the City Clerk's Office, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH or emailed to cityclerk@laconianh.gov.

How do I complete the absentee ballot?

Your absentee ballot will come with a set of instructions and two envelopes: an affidavit envelope and a return envelope. Once you complete your ballot, place it in the affidavit envelope and seal it. Please sign one of the two affidavits on that envelope that best suits your situation. Put the affidavit envelope into the return envelope, seal and mail or deliver it.

An absentee ballot can only be returned by mail, in person by the voter, or by a delivery agent*. You may return your completed ballot in person to the City Clerk's office. Please do not return your absentee ballot by placing it in the drop box slot on the side of City Hall. Any ballots left in that location will not be counted.

Absentee ballots will be accepted by mail, in-person by the voter, or by a delivery agent through 5 pm the day before Election Day at the City Clerk's Office. On Election Day, absentee ballots will only be accepted by mail until 5 pm.

You may notice that the mailing envelope provided to mail your absentee ballot states "extra postage may be required". Please be sure to have two stamps affixed to this envelope before mailing.

**Delivery agent is defined as someone else delivering your ballot to the City Clerk's Office. Please contact the City Clerk's office for details if someone else will be delivering your ballot for you.*

How do I know my absentee ballot was received?

You can track the progress of your absentee ballot on the State of New Hampshire Secretary of State's website [here](#). You can verify receipt of your application, obtain the date when your absentee ballot was mailed to you, and the date the City Clerk's office receives your completed absentee ballot.

**New Hampshire's Ten Year
Transportation Plan
Public Hearing – 7:00 pm
October 27, 2021
Laconia City Hall
City Council Chambers**



The NH Department of Transportation will hold a public hearing for the Lakes Region on the State's Transportation Ten Year Plan for the years 2023 to 2032.

The ten year plan is the method the State uses to determine which projects are funded for the ten years of the plan. This includes funding for the State's road system as well as those programs that support Laconia such as State Municipal Bridge Aid and the Transportation Alternatives Program. The State Municipal Bridge Aid funds 80% of the projects required to rehabilitate and replace bridges. Without this funding Laconia's taxpayers would have to fund all of the costs associated with major bridge projects. The Transportation Alternative Program funds projects such as bicycle and multiuse trails as sidewalk projects.

THEN ...

'Gen.' William F. Knight quietly observed his 99th birthday, Oct. 13, 1946, at his home, located at the corner of Court and Main streets. Knight never served in the military. His title derived from appointment, 1895-1897, as quartermaster general on Gov. Charles A. Busiel's ceremonial military staff. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The 'Gen. Knight' House (built by Merchant Daniel Tilton in 1866) was moved to Rowe Court in 1948 and the corner became a vacant lot until the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s. (After use as an apartment house and Labbe Oil Co. office, the house was razed in early 2009 to make way for Walgreens — seen in distance — which opened, Oct. 9, 2009.) The corner site is now part of the parking lot for the Best Western Plus Landmark Inn, opened originally, in 1974, as a Ramada Inn. At left, Melcher & Prescott Insurance has replaced the Harriman Block, including the old Gilford Academy Building. (Adam Drapcho/ The Laconia Daily Sun)
