Another holiday season has gone by and many of you may be wondering what to do with your cardboard boxes. The City has a cardboard box collection point at 257 Messer Street that is open 24 hours a day seven days a week.

So gather up all of those corrugated cardboard boxes you're sure to have accumulated during the holidaysflatten them down, pile them up and bring them to the cardboard collection bin to be compacted and recycled.

Cardboard brought to the Transfer Station versus being placed at the curb saved the City over \$77 per ton in the month of December, 2021. Please help us save solid waste/recycling tax dollars by dropping off your cardboard.

Any property owner or business in Laconia can use the Messer Street cardboard collection point.

Cardboard recycling is clean and easy. Corrugated cardboard only please! No cereal, soda/beer or shoe boxes, and no bubble wrap or air pillows.





REMINDER:
**Dumping Snow into
Waterbodies is Prohibited**



Snow cleared from roads and parking lots contains debris, trash, sand, salt and other contaminates that are harmful to water quality.

While snow can be stored by surface waters at least 25 feet from the high water mark, it should NEVER be dumped into waterbodies.

Due to the contaminates and debris snow contains, dumping snow into waterbodies without a permit is illegal. RSA 485-A:13, I(a) prohibits discharging wastes to surface waters without a permit.

Disposal of Christmas Trees

The City of Laconia does not pick up Christmas trees curbside. This allows the Department of Public Works to more efficiently and effectively utilize personnel and equipment time.

Laconia residents can bring their Christmas trees to either the City's Transfer Station at 385 Meredith Center Road during its hours of operation (Monday - Friday, 7:30 am to 3:30 pm, Saturday 8:00 am to Noon) or bring them to the designated area in the parking lot at the end of Memorial Park Drive (near its intersection with West St.) by Memorial Park, which is available every day.

Christmas trees may also be taken to the Brush Dump on Friday or Saturday from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm unless it snows. In the event of a snowstorm the Brush Dump will be closed to allow all Public Works personnel to work on snow removal.

Winter Information from the Department of Public Works

DID YOU KNOW?

...That drivers cannot park their vehicles overnight in the City's downtown parking lots? Cars and trucks that park overnight interfere with Public Works' ability to clear snow from these parking lots.

Instead, please park in the parking garage overnight. The Police Department announces through Twitter whenever Public Works will be plowing or removing snow from these parking lots, and owners of vehicles parking in the City lots may be fined or have their vehicles towed at their expense to ensure that these parking lots can be plowed.


And did you know that it is unsafe to plow a driveway's snow across a street and leave it there? Traffic passing by your driveway during the plowing could have an accident as a result of hitting the plow truck or hitting the snow windrow left by the plow.

Also, please be aware that pushing or blowing snow onto a City sidewalk could prevent the City from clearing the sidewalk if the snow pile is too large for the sidewalk plows to clear. Please ensure that you or your plow contractor do not push driveway snow across a public street or blow snow into the sidewalk. This will help Public Works clear the streets and sidewalks after a storm to keep our community safe.

The City Council has implemented an Ordinance to minimize these problems. Public Works will reach out to educate a property owner if there is a violation and arrive at a resolution to the problem. The City appreciates your willingness to work with us to ensure a safer community.





THEN ...

Walker Square — as the intersection of Main, South Main and Court streets with Union Avenue was designated by the City Council, Nov. 26, 1917, in honor of Lyman B. Walker, early Meredith Bridge lawyer and landowner — is seen in the early 1900s, with the Old Country Store of John Parker Smith at left, on the later site of the Harriman Block. The building with the columns was the Gilford Academy Building after it had been moved from Academy Square in 1886. Part of the residence of William F. Knight is seen at extreme right, and the two buildings on Court Street beyond it were occupied by a store and the old City Hotel. Court Street still had its elm trees. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

What had not been removed or rebuilt earlier was changed dramatically by the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s and early 1970s — including the building now occupied by Melcher & Prescott Insurance, at left, and the parking lot for the Best Western Plus Landmark Inn at right. A Walgreens, on the site of the old City Hotel changed the Rowe Court area significantly in 2009. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)



Laconia Water Department **Prevention is Better than Reaction!**



If the temperature inside a house gets below 32 degree Fahrenheit (0 degree Celsius) it's likely that the water supply pipes and the drain traps will freeze. When water freezes it expands 9 percent, and if there is no room for expansion it's possible that the pipe will develop a crack and eventually leak once the ice thaws out. Fixing a burst pipe can be expensive, but the damage from uncontrolled water leakage can easily reach into the thousands of dollars.

The majority of the calls received for frozen water pipes and water meters are a result of inadequate heating and cold air drafts where piping is located in the home. It is recommended that property owners check their property for these conditions and identify the location of their water meter and shutoff valve before an emergency.

If for any reason you cannot stop the flow of water from a frozen or broken pipe, call the Water Department's 24-hour emergency number at (603) 524-0907.



Powerhouse kicks off the 2022 season with an original musical!

Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative opens its 2022 season with the world premiere reading of *My Backyard* January 7-9 at the Belknap Mill. With the book by Powerhouse Producer Bryan Halperin, and music and lyrics by composer Krisanthi Pappas, *My Backyard* is the final piece of the seven week "Celebrate our Town - Laconia" project that began with the November Powerhouse production of *Our Town* at the Colonial.

My Backyard is a dramatic musical about a young musician in the throes of a career and personal crisis who returns to her childhood backyard. In doing so, she explores her relationships with friends and family as well as the inspiration for her music. We follow this performer as she struggles to appreciate all the painful, mundane, funny, and beautiful aspects that make up everyday life.

Filled with 16 heartwarming songs that run the gamut from jazzy swing to poignant tender ballads, *My Backyard* reminds us that when life doesn't go our way, we must find our way back to a place and a time when it all made sense and start again. As a staged reading, actors will be performing their roles and singing their songs script in hand, with minimal blocking. Each performance will be followed by a talkback where the audience can ask questions of the authors and give feedback to help in the future development of the musical.

Performances are January 7 and 8 at 7 pm, and January 9 at 2 pm on the 3rd floor Chertok Gallery of the Belknap Mill. Masks will be required for all attendees and seating is limited. Tickets are \$10 and can be purchased by cash or check at the door, but reservations are recommended.
