





PROPERTY TAX BILLS WERE MAILED 11/28/22!



'TIS the season for Property Taxes!

Tax bills were mailed on November 28, 2022 and are due December 28, 2022. The 2022 tax rate was set at \$14.85 per thousand; this is a decrease of \$4.01 from the 2021 rate of \$18.86 per thousand.

Your July 2022 tax bills reflect half of the 2021 tax rate of \$9.43. Tax bills are calculated as follows: The July installment is $\frac{1}{2}$ of the previous year's rate total, multiplied by your previous year's assessed value. The December installment is the new rate (which is determined by the NH Department of Revenue), multiplied by your updated assessed value to get your total tax for the year. We then minus out the July installment and you pay the difference. The Assessing Office has until the December billing to finalize your assessments for the tax year.

Questions about your assessed value should be directed to the Assessing Office at 603-527-1268. Questions about payments should be directed to the Tax Office at 603-527-1269.

Payment options are: In-person, the drop box on the side of City Hall, through the mail at PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247, over the phone at 1-855-906-0411 or online at www.laconianh.gov

Please note there is a fee of 2.79 % for all credit/debit card transactions and a \$0.95 fee for all ACH transactions online.



Our yesterdays

THEN ...

The Huse Machine Shop and Laconia Needle Co. building at 117 Union Ave., Laconia, is seen, Oct. 28, 1933, at the time of a National Recovery Administration parade more than 2 1/2 miles long, 'requiring an hour and five minutes to pass the reviewing stand' and in which nearly 4,000 individuals marched — for which the decorated Laconia Needle Co. vehicle had been one of 'hundreds and hundreds of floats.' During the Great Depression, the NRA 'supervised fair trade codes and guaranteed laborers a right to collective bargaining.' (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Huse Machine Shop moved out of the building in 1943, but the Laconia Needle Co. remained there until 1961, when it opened a new plant in the O'Shea Industrial Park. The Beauchaine & Sons Machine Shop moved to the building in July 1963 and later became the Beau Division of Vernitron before moving to the Airport Industrial Park in July 1988. After remaining vacant for 16 years, the building was torn down in March 2004 for construction of 'Millview' by the Laconia Area Community Land Trust (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)
