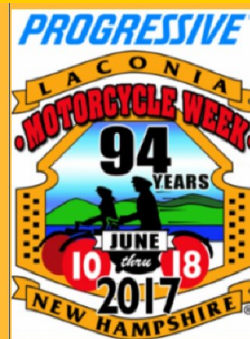

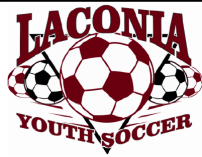

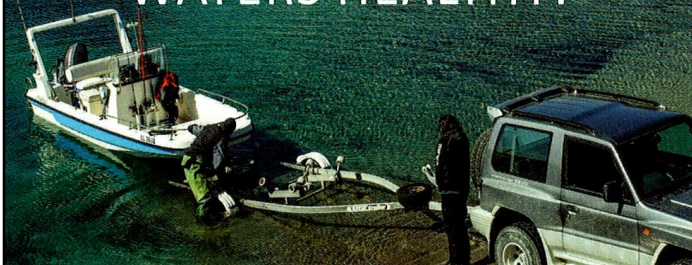

HELP STOP THE SPREAD OF AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES



In New Hampshire, you are never more than a short drive away from a lake, pond or river where you can launch your motorboat, sailboat, canoe, kayak or paddleboard into the water.

By always making sure that your boat, trailer and gear are **cleaned**, **drained** and **dry** before launching into the water, you will prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species, and will help keep our waters boatable, enjoyable and healthy.

If you have questions or if you believe you found a new infestation of aquatic invasive species, contact the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services Exotic Species Program at (603) 271-2248.

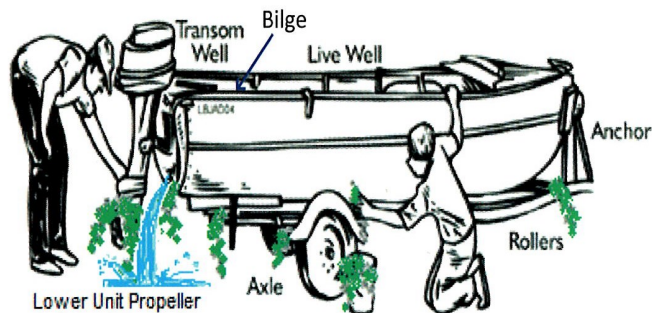


Before leaving ANY boat launch area:

CLEAN any mud, plants, animals and debris off your boat, trailer and equipment, and dispose away from the waterbody.

DRAIN your motor, live wells, bait wells, ballast bags and tanks, and bilge areas away from the waterbody.

DRY anything that came in contact with the water. Rinse and towel-dry all equipment or allow for five days drying time.

NEW STATE LAW, RSA 487:16(c-e) EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2017

When transporting boats between waterbodies:

- ALL hitchhiking fragments of vegetation must be removed.
- ALL drain plugs must be in the OPEN position.

PROPERTY TAX BILLS HAVE BEEN MAILED!

Tax bills were mailed on May 30th. They are due on July 5th. Payments are accepted by mail and at the counter in City Hall during normal business hours. Property Tax Credit Forms

DP-8 forms are now available in the Assessing Office, or on-line at www.revenue.nh.gov. The deadline for filing is June 30. This form applies to the Low/Moderate income homeowner's property tax credit.

We have completed the replacement of approximately 3000 feet of problematic water pipe which should reduce interruptions in water service for years to come.

At this point all that remains is some water service work and general cleanup which will begin after Bike Week.
