



Prescott Farm offers Intro to Gardening Course and Welcomes New Volunteers



Have you ever wanted to garden but have no idea where to start? Do you have a green thumb already but nowhere to put it to use? Prescott Farm Environmental Education Center on White Oaks Road in Laconia welcomes you to join us for our new Introduction to Organic Gardening program, beginning Saturday May 5, 2018 at 10am. In this 6-week series you will get your hands dirty learning all of the basics – garden planning, soil preparation, starting seeds, building raised beds, weed identification, care, maintenance and more. By June you and your newly “green” thumb will have the skills to start your own backyard garden and become part of our essential garden volunteer crew.

“I am so excited to get this year’s garden underway,” says Andie Hessian, Naturalist and Educator at Prescott Farm. Andie began with Prescott Farm in October 2017. She graduated from George Washington University in Washington, DC with a B.S. in Public Health, where she became interested in the connections between

food, the environment, and health. She spent two years as a FoodCorps service member in rural Arkansas where she managed a school garden and taught food- and garden-based lessons to students of all ages. Andie has great plans for Prescott Farm’s teaching gardens throughout the Spring, Summer and into our Farmhouse Kitchen series this Fall. 

Great Outcome for 40 Days of Giving

The First United Methodist Church of Gilford is pleased to announce that Church members and friends collected over 1,000 items during their 40 Days of Giving Program that took place during Lent. Even more exciting than that, was the help of a group of boys and their moms from Laconia who counted the items, packed them into boxes and then delivered them to the Belknap House, New Beginnings and the Vineyard Church food pantry and soup kitchen.

Missions Co-Chairman, Alger Conger, contacted Andrea Condodemetraky after reading about her son and his friends who are known as the "Cereal Heroes". This past winter they shoveled walks in their neighborhoods to raise money to help provide breakfast food to some of the children who attend school with them. Andrea contacted the three organizations ahead of time to arrange for the items to be dropped off, then the boys and their moms came to the church the Monday after Easter to count the items, bag and box them, and load them into four vehicles for delivery.

Mr. Conger estimated the "man hours" it took to count, load and deliver all of the items to figure out the dollar value of their time and the Missions Committee decided to give the group a donation of \$400. After the donation was made, they found out that the Cereal Heroes' next project is to make Foster Care bags for emergency Foster Care placement of students attending the Laconia Schools. The donation will allow them to complete their project! The Methodist Church wants to thank all of the people who donated to 40 Days of Giving this year as well as the volunteers who helped load cars, and to the Cereal Heroes and their families.

Come and visit him and see what we mean!


