



The public is invited to join us Wednesday, July 25 at 6:30 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Building, for this free lecture.


Bridges is a long-time New England resident, former editor of New England Power Sports Post and present Laconia Motorcycle Week Poet Laureate and Archivist.


