



- State residents and nonresidents alike can fish any inland water - or saltwater - in New Hampshire that day without a fishing license.
- Note that season dates, bag limits and all other fishing regulations must be followed on Free Fishing Day.



Join us Wednesday, Jan. 23 at 2 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Theater for a fascinating documentary on Mount Rushmore.




Most of Hill's stories involve first-hand experiences, which he masterfully recounts, sprinkling in a healthy dose of humor as they unfold.





