

The First United Methodist Church is once again looking toward what we can do for the needy with the Lenten program **"40 Days of Giving."**

This year the primary focus for "40 Days of Giving" will be providing non-perishable food items and personal hygiene items for Isaiah 61, an organization that serves the homeless, and the Laconia High School food pantry.

Running through Lent, concluding on April 20, the Church will be collecting non-perishable foods and personal hygiene items or financial donations.

Church members have been challenged to donate one item each day during the 40 days of Lent. Anyone wishing to participate in the 40 Days of Giving is welcome to bring items each Sunday of Lent, or drop items off Monday - Friday from 8:30 am until 12 noon at the Church office. Items being collected include the following:

Non-perishable food items: Canned meat, vegetables, soups, and fruit, macaroni & cheese or rice, baked beans, spaghetti sauce, boxed hot and cold cereals, hot chocolate mix, juice, peanut butter, pasta, tea, coffee, canned milk, etc. Please, no glass jars of any kind.

Personal Care items: Feminine products, shampoo, bath soap, disposable razors, shaving cream, deodorant, laundry detergent, etc.

A donation of \$1, 50 cents, or 10 cents per day - whatever works - designated for the FUMC with a note on the note line - Missions Committee Lenten Project, will help immensely!

Seasonal weight limits

The City of Laconia will be posting a 10 ton weight limit on select roads beginning March 18th. The weight limits will remain in effect until the roads are solid.

Public Works will begin installing the weight limit signs the week of March 11th. A map of those roads with a seasonal weight limit can be found on the [Public Works website](#).

Permits may be available for loads over 10 tons depending on conditions and time of day. Please contact Public Works at 528-6379 for any questions or for a permit.

Parking on or blocking sidewalks

The City prohibits parking on or blocking City sidewalks at any time of the year. The City is required under the Federal American Disability Act (ADA) regulations to ensure that a sidewalk has a minimum width of 48 inches and is clear of all obstructions along its whole length. Additionally, automobiles blocking a sidewalk force Public Works sidewalk snow removal equipment to leave the sidewalk at a location accessible by the equipment, which may leave up to a few hundred feet of sidewalk unplowed.



The City is asking your assistance to ensure your automobiles do not block the sidewalk to ensure a safe community for the pedestrians who use the City's sidewalks.

Businesses recycling corrugated cardboard



The City asks that all businesses using City recycling collection services bring their corrugated cardboard to the City's corrugated cardboard recycling center at 257 Messer Street. The City is asking for your assistance implementing this change due to the large increase in the cost to process recycled materials. Approximately 18 months ago, the City's recycling used to be processed for free. However, the value of recycled materials has dropped so much that the City now pays a contractor to process recycling material collected from its residents and business.

The City for the last year has paid over \$90 per ton for processing recycling. Corrugated cardboard is very heavy and by weight is a large component of the recyclable material collected. Removing it from curbside collection and bringing it to the corrugated cardboard compactor minimizes the City's recycling program costs. Bringing corrugated cardboard to the compactor will help the City control cost growth in this program, allowing the funds to be used for other more critical programs.

Residential property owners and renters are also encouraged to use the corrugated cardboard recycling center!

BE A POSITIVE ROLE MODEL



Research shows that when it comes to alcohol and other drugs, children are likely to model their parents' behaviors – both healthy and unhealthy ones.

Your attitude about drugs and alcohol can also influence your child's attitude about drugs and alcohol – and have an effect on his/her future behavior. Here are 3 ways that you can be a good role model for your child.

If you choose to drink alcohol, consume small amounts with a meal or for a celebratory occasion.

Don't become intoxicated in front of your child.

Drinking alcohol in excess around your child or using illicit drugs increases the likelihood they will develop alcohol or drug problems.

When it comes to prescription drugs, be sure to follow the instructions properly. Do not use leftover prescription drugs in your house for casual, non-medical use. It's also important not to share your prescription medications with other family members or friends.

Be sure to dispose of unused prescription drugs properly.

Don't save prescribed medications for when they may come in handy, use it later without a doctor's consent, or share the medications with others.

Children learn behavior by observing their parents' behavior. That means your child picks up on the way you cope with stressful situations and how you manage your emotions. When you are overwhelmed, try exercising or using other stress management techniques in order to teach your children that they do not need to drink or use drugs to cope with life's problems.




Now is a Good Time to Get Your Boat & Jet Ski Registration!

The Belknap Mill is thrilled to welcome home the Belknap Mill Quilters Guild in March! A small variety of the incredible work of the Guild will be featured in the 'Quilts in the Mill' exhibit in the Riverside Gallery from March 2 – March 30th. The exhibit will be open to the public Monday-Friday 9am to 5pm and Saturdays 9am to 4pm. An artist's reception, open for all, will be held on Wednesday, March 6 at 6pm.

The Belknap Mill Quilters Guild began as a small group of quilters looking for a place to gather and work on their favored pastime. Founded in 1978, the group met for 23 years in this timeless brick structure and shared their works of art at the annual quilt show held in October. By 2001, the Guild had outgrown the space of the Belknap Mill and found a new home with the Opechee Conference Center. They now meet at the Beane Conference Center on Blueberry Lane in Laconia.

This quiet group of almost 120 members can be found each month offering programs and lectures on the topic of quilting and fiber arts. During the two 'Sit-n-Sew' workshops held annually, members focus on completing quilts of all sizes that will be donated to several local organizations such as the Spaulding Youth Center, the Interlakes Children's Fund and the Recovery Program at the Belknap County Jail. The Comfort Quilt Program has provided thousands of quilts to those in need.






