



Disposal of Christmas Trees

The City of Laconia does not pick up Christmas trees curbside. This allows the Department of Public Works to more efficiently and effectively utilize personnel and equipment time. Laconia residents can bring their Christmas trees to either the City's Transfer Station at 385 Meredith Center Road during its hours of operation (Monday - Friday, 7:30 am to 3:30 pm, Saturday 8:00 am to Noon) or bring them to the designated area in the parking lot at the end of Memorial Park Drive (near its intersection with West St.) by Memorial Park, which is available every day. Christmas trees may also be taken to the Brush Dump on Friday or Saturday from 10 am to 3 pm unless it snows. In the event of a snowstorm the Brush Dump will be closed to allow all Public Works personnel to work on snow removal. For more information call DPW at 528-6379.

The Presidential Primary date is set for February 11, 2020. Absentee ballots can be requested through the City Clerk's Office, or by clicking [here](#). Completed applications can be dropped off to the Clerk's Office, faxed to 524-1766, emailed to cityclerk@laconianh.gov, or mailed to the City Clerk's Office, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247.

Absentee ballots must be received no later than 5:00 pm on the day of the election in order for your vote to count.

You can verify receipt of your application, the date your absentee ballot was mailed to you, the date the Clerk receives your completed absentee ballot, and after the election learn if your absentee ballot was rejected/not counted and why.




Winter Parking Ban!


THEN . . .

The Col. Thomas J. Whipple House at 144 Pleasant Street is seen in the late 19th century, before the street was paved. Whipple, an Army veteran of both the Mexican-American and Civil wars, was a lawyer and practiced here from 1849 until his death, Dec. 21, 1889. He is perhaps best remembered as having raised, with another officer, the 12th New Hampshire Regiment of Volunteers — 1,000 men — from Belknap County in only a week in 1862. These buildings remained on site until Aug. 23, 1922, when a 2 a.m. fire consumed the large barn — said to be 'one of the oldest buildings in the city' — but was stopped at 'the rear of the ell leading to the main part of the house.' The Whipple heirs owned the property until the early 1920s, when Dr. William A. King moved there from his former residence on Lincoln Street and continued to practice dentistry from his new home until 1945 and died in 1950. The structure glimpsed at the left was the barn attached to the Lewis S. Busiel House at 130 Pleasant St. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



. . . AND NOW

Sometime in the 1920s, the Whipple House was either replaced or remodeled to create the stucco building that is there today and at which, as early as 1929 and perhaps earlier, Dr. King's dental office was then located. (Newspaper accounts in mid-August 1923 refer to remodeling and repair to the King residence on Pleasant Street but do not provide details.) Since Dr. King's death, the building has been home to law and accounting offices, among other occupants. The Christian Science Church, at left, was built in 1923, with first service held, Jan. 1, 1924. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)
