Free Tax Help - Federal Income Tax Assistance Available AARP Foundation Tax-Aide Program to be offered at Laconia Senior Center 17 Church Street

Again this year the AARP Tax-Aide program, which provides Free Tax Assistance in preparing and electronically filing your Federal Income Tax return, will be offered at the Laconia Senior Center at 17 Church Street. While the program gives special attention to all those 60 years of age and up, taxpayers with low and moderate income will also be accommodated by AARP personnel.

Assistance will be provided as follows:

Wednesdays and Thursdays, 8:30 am to 3:00 pm, from February 5 thru March 26

Thursdays only, 8:30 am to 3:00 pm from April 1 thru April 9

Please note that April 9th is the last day for AARP Free Tax Help at this location!

The service will be offered on an appointment basis. **Call the Laconia Senior Center at 524-7689 to make an appointment.** Taxpayers are asked to bring the following: photo ID, copy of last year's income tax return, W-2 forms, any 1099 forms, dependent care provider info, proof of itemizing deductions, health insurance documents and Social Security cards or documentation for yourself and all dependents.

Our yesterdays

Our thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN . . .

The residence of John Carroll Moulton, next to the railroad tracks on the north side of today's Laconia Public Library lot, had been willed to the city of Laconia at his death in July 1894 as the site for a library. With the death of Napoleon Bonaparte Gale, five months later, in December 1894, another bequest to the city provided funds for 'a memorial building and public park.' The mayor and City Council appointed a committee, 125 years ago this week, to erect the library building and park. In mid-April 1895, the city purchased the rest of the Moulton property (between the mansion and Church Street, off-photo at right). Meanwhile, the mansion was operated as a hotel, known as the Crawford House, for a few years until the buildings on the site were sold at auction in late October 1900 and torn down to clear the site for construction to begin in 1901. . . . **AND NOW**

Construction on the library continued from 1901 until the new structure opened, June 9, 1903. The Moulton mansion was taken down with the intention to re-erect it somewhere but ultimately the materials were sold as second-hand lumber. The site of the mansion (about where the evergreen trees at left are today) became part of the library park, with the Gale Memorial Library building occupying the center part of the lot. The Forestry (later Federal) Building, at left across the railroad tracks, was built in 1939-1940. Church Street is off-photo at right. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)

Assessing
