What Does 116 Tons of Cardboard Look Like?



We don't know either, but that's how much our residents and businesses have brought to the "cardboard cage" on Messer St. over the past 2 ½ years. Thank you to everyone!

Why separate out your cardboard from other recycling and bring it to 257 Messer St.?

- Cardboard has much greater value now than other paper/plastic recyclables.
- Separating cardboard out keeps it clean of other contaminants and adds more value to our end product.
- We pay to get rid of trash/recycling by the ton. Cardboard is one of the heavier recyclables so there is much greater benefit because we are removing more tonnage.
- It's easy: Flatten the boxes and tuck them away. When you have enough or are headed towards Messer St, drop them off. No mess. No odor.
- The cardboard cage is available 24/7. Drive right up and slide the cardboard through the slot.
- Helps reduce the cost of the City's Solid Waste Program.
- Something so simple makes a difference and makes you feel good!

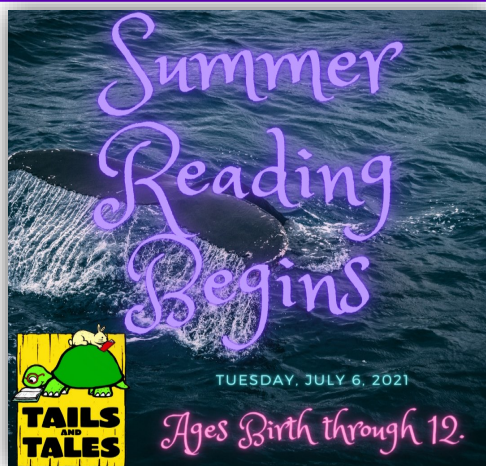

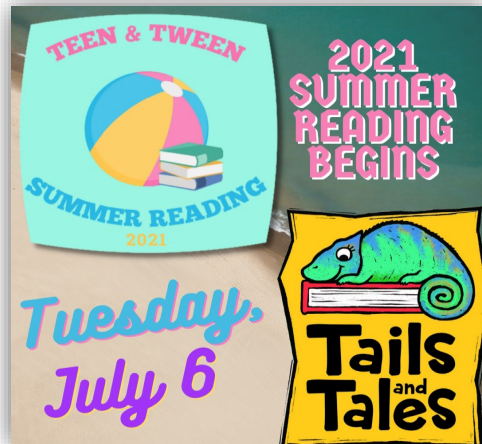

Our yesterdays

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN ...

These three buildings on Elm Street, seen, Nov. 16, 1941, included the Clark Block, center, the law office of 'Squire' Samuel Clement Clark (1832-1897), whose home on Union Avenue was later known as the 'Hathaway House' before its demolition in 2014. Doctors Oliver and Ossian Wilbur Goss had offices in the Clark Block and, at one time the Post Office was also located there, along with the printing plant of the Belknap Republican. For more than 40 years, beginning in the 1870s, the Geo. H. Smith dry and fancy goods store occupied the building at right. Building 25 of Scott & Williams is glimpsed at extreme left and the photographer was standing on Park Street (Laconia Public Library)



... AND NOW

The three buildings were demolished in the early 1960s. Today, the entrance to Lake Opechee Inn & Spa occupies the site — directly across from Park Street. Building 25 of Scott & Willilams was demolished in 1991. (Adam Drapcho/ The Laconia Daily Sun)

As we approach the 4th of July holiday, and the heart of the summer season, it is time to pause to remember that safety has to be a priority when using consumer fireworks. Injury and unintended fires are a real possibility. It is everyone's responsibility to make sure these do not happen.

According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2018 there were 9,100 fireworks related injuries nationwide, and 62% of them occurred in the month surrounding the Fourth of July. Almost half of the reported injuries occurred in persons under 20 years old.

The National Fire Protection Association reported that in 2018 19,500 fires were caused by fireworks. Almost 10% of these were building fires.

With those statistics, it is important we remember some key points to keep everyone safe...

Only permissible fireworks are allowed in NH. Permissible means they have been made legal for sale, possession and use. These can be purchased in licensed NH retail stores. Other devices are illegal!

When using permissible fireworks, it is important to follow some very important rules to keep everyone safe.

- Display only on your own property
- Read all safety warnings
- Have a fire extinguisher and/or water hose nearby
- You must be 21 or older to buy or display permissible fireworks
- Always wear eye and hearing protection
- Light only one device at a time and move away quickly
- Keep all spectators a safe distance away
- Only display fireworks away from anything that can burn
- Discard used fireworks in a bucket of water; **do not throw away in regular garbage**
- Keep children away from where fireworks are being lit
- Do not allow young children to hold sparklers

Laconia Fire Department wants everyone to enjoy this holiday weekend, and we also want everyone to be safe.

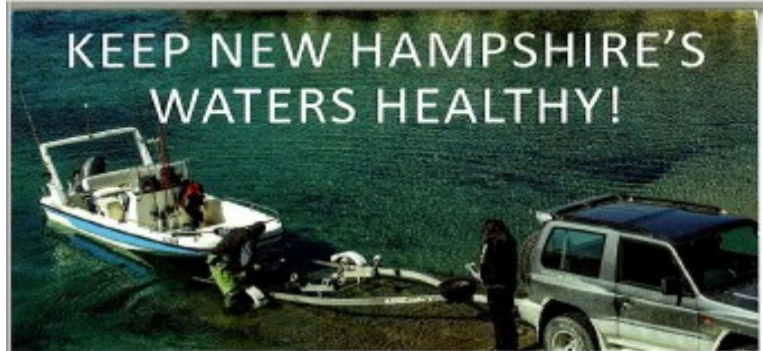

HELP STOP THE SPREAD OF AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES



In New Hampshire, you are never more than a short drive away from a lake, pond or river where you can launch your motorboat, sailboat, canoe, kayak or paddleboard into the water.

By always making sure that your boat, trailer and gear are **cleaned, drained and dry** before launching into the water, you will prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species, and will help keep our waters boatable, enjoyable and healthy.

If you have questions or if you believe you found a new infestation of aquatic invasive species, contact the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services Exotic Species Program at (603) 271-2248.



Per [State RSA, Title XLV, Chapter 466](#) all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the City Clerk prior to April 30th. A late fee of \$1/month is assessed for those dogs not registered by that date.

Beginning July 1st, a civil fine of \$25 is now due. If the fine is not paid within 15 calendar days of the notice of forfeiture, the case may be forwarded to the District Court as a violation with a fine not to exceed \$50.

Fees for registering dogs are shown below:

Late charge per month as of June 1:	\$ 1.00
Civil fine for failure to register by April 30 will begin July 1st:	\$25.00

Altered dog (or puppy under 7 mo. old):	\$6.50
Unaltered dog:	\$9.00
Senior (1st dog for owners over 65):	\$2.00
Replacement tag:	\$1.50

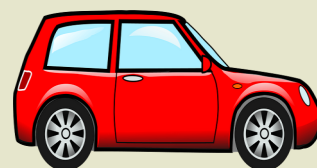

Lake/Ponds Algal or Cyanobacteria Blooms

There is a perennial event in local bodies of water each year around this time that none of us look forward to, those algae blooms that are both unpleasant to see, smell and taste as well as being potentially toxic to domestic animals, livestock, wildlife, and humans.

These blooms contain millions of Cyanobacteria (blue/green bacteria) that pose a potential public health danger as they may produce toxins, referred to as “cyanotoxins.”. These toxins can be ingested by organisms in the food chain and released into the water when cells die. However, the amount and type of toxin produced varies over time and from lake to lake and a cyanobac-

terial bloom may produce very little to no toxin in one lake, and a later bloom in the same lake could produce a large toxin concentration.

Cyanotoxins can cause both acute and chronic illnesses, as these toxins target the liver, kidney, and central nervous system, and can irritate the skin as well.

Acute effects, such as skin and mucous membrane irritations, can occur after short-term exposure with water containing cyanotoxins.

Chronic effects, such as liver, kidney, and central nervous system damage, can occur over a long period of time from ingesting water containing toxins.

NHDES’ Harmful Algal and Cyanobacterial Bloom Program coordinates monitoring, public communication, and educational outreach efforts regarding cyanobacterial blooms.

If you suspect a waterbody is experiencing a cyanobacterial bloom, call or text the hotline at (603) 848-8094 or email HAB@des.nh.gov and follow these steps to minimize immediate risks:

- **Do not wade or swim or drink the water.**
- **Keep pets or livestock out.**
- **Wash your hands if you have made contact.**

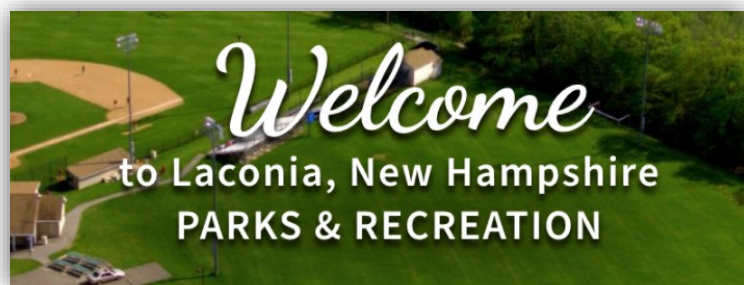

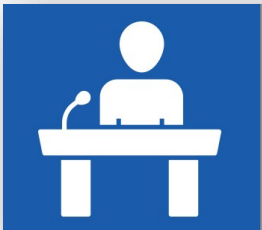
