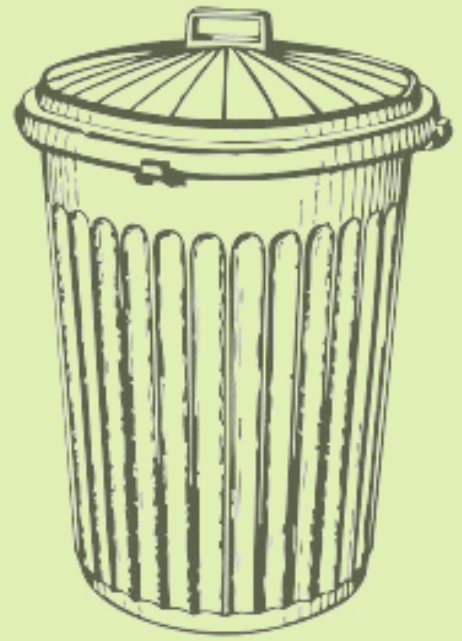
Do you have questions about the City's curbside trash pickup?

Last year the City Council directed City Staff to strictly enforce the City's solid waste rules. Since then, Public Works and the Planning Department have notified over 500 property owners that they were in violation of City Ordinances.

Property owners are given a warning on the first violation. The warning is to educate them on the City's expectations per the City's Ordinances. When a second violation occurs, the property owner is sent a notification of fine letter with an opportunity to appeal.

The City's solid waste rules as they apply to residences include:

- Solid waste can only be placed curbside for collection after 7 pm the day before the area's collection day. The cans must be removed before 7 pm on the day of collection.
- All trash must be in plastic bags and be placed in a trash can. The trash can cannot be overflowing.
- All solid waste cans must have a lid.
- Single family residences can have two trash cans.
- A duplex can have four trash cans.
- A triplex can have six trash cans.
- Any apartment complex over 3 units can have only 7 trash cans.
- Recycling containers are unlimited; however, the contractor will only collect recycling containers that are not contaminated with trash.
- Solid waste containers can weigh no more than 50 lbs including the container's contents.
- The City does not collect tires, freon containing appliances or electronics at the curb.
- Large items can be placed curbside for collection if the item is a 2 person lift. Each item must have a bulky item sticker attached to it.
- Metal bulky items with a bulky item sticker are only collected on the first Wednesday of the month and by appointment only by calling Public Works at 528-6379.
- Large items placed curbside for another party to take for free are considered trash and can only remain curbside from 7 pm the day before the area's collection day to 7 pm on collection day.

THEN . . .

Urban Renewal was 'rapidly taking shape with cement being poured,' Sept. 9, 1971, 'in front of the Federal Savings and Loan Association ... while the pedestrian mall is being built. Soon planters will be installed and flag poles raised and old 'Bank Square' will once again be a thing of beauty,' The Citizen reported, 50 years ago this week. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



. . . AND NOW

After some 25 years as a pedestrian mall, with a performance space on the raised platform, this part of Main Street was reopened to one-way vehicular traffic, July 8, 1994 — 27 years ago now. The Federal Savings and Loan building (which included a Brooks Pharmacy, back in the early 1970s) is now a branch of Citizens Bank. On the other side of Hanover Street, Newberry's is now the Laconia Antique Center. Laconia National and City Savings bank buildings — later Peoples National Bank & Trust — are now part of the Lakes Region Mental Health Center. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)



CITY OF LACONIA Notice of Public Hearing

The City of Laconia will hold a public hearing on September 13, 2021, during the regular City Council meeting which will begin at 7:00 pm at City Hall, 45 Beacon Street East, in the Armand A. Bolduc City Council Chamber in order to receive public comment on whether the language printed below should be placed on the November Municipal Ballot relative to amending the City Charter:

Amending Article 1 by adding as Section 1:05, to read as follows:

"The six wards shall be constituted to have as equal population as is practicable. To achieve that goal, upon the issuance of the results of the 2020 census, and every 10 years thereafter upon receipt of the federal census results, the City Council shall promptly initiate review of the ward boundaries to determine if redistricting is necessary. Any necessary changes to the ward lines shall, as near as is practicable, ensure that the wards have equal population.

If the City Council determines that ward redistricting is necessary upon receipt of the federal census results, then the City Council shall promptly undertake and enact such redistricting of ward boundaries in the form of an ordinance, which shall be approved by a two-thirds majority vote of all elected members of the City Council after a duly advertised public hearing posted in two public places at least seven days in advance of such hearing.

Any changes so enacted shall thereafter appear as revisions to Charter Section 1:02."

All six wards will be narrowing the Mayoral race from three to two candidates and Ward 4 will also be narrowing down the Council seat race from three to two candidates.

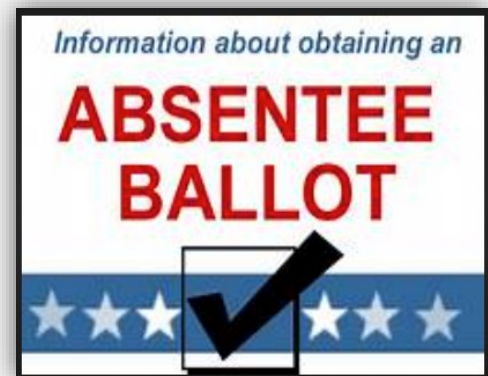

This testing is open to the public for observation in accordance with RSA 656:42.



Absentee Ballot Application Forms Are Now Available!

The Municipal Primary Election is set for September 14, 2021. Polls are open from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm. Absentee ballots can be requested through the City Clerk's Office, or by clicking [here](#).

Completed applications can be dropped off to the Clerk's Office, faxed to 524-1766, emailed to cityclerk@laconianh.gov, or mailed to the City Clerk's Office, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247. Absentee ballots must be received no later than 5:00 pm on Monday, September 13, 2021 in order for your vote to count.

Visit the [Secretary of State's](#) website to track your ballot. You can verify receipt of your application, the date your absentee ballot was mailed to you, the date the Clerk receives your completed absentee ballot, and after the election learn if your absentee ballot was rejected/not counted and why. 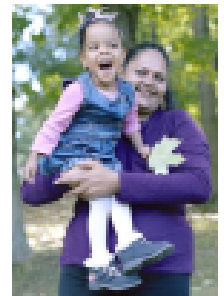

On Saturday, September 11th members of the Green Sanctuary Committee of the Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia, in partnership with the Laconia-Gilford Lions Club, are collecting recyclable plastic from 11 AM until 1:30 PM in front of the little white church at 72 Pleasant Street.



We can all help this recycling activity now by starting to save soft plastics and not throw them into the trash.

We ARE collecting clean plastic bags and wrappers, plastic grocery bags, pet food bags, vegetable bags (potatoes, carrots, celery, rice, etc.), bubble-wrap, air packing bags, bread bags, wraps from around 6-pack cans of juice and dry-cleaning bags.

We ARE NOT collecting hard plastic or rigid containers.

Why is this important? Plastic bags that are not recycled end up in landfills or in the sea contaminating our drinking water and seafood with microplastics and dangerous chemicals. Plastics also are burned releasing toxins into our atmosphere.

Thanks to you, our greater Laconia community, in the past two events we have collected just shy of 700 (seven-hundred) lbs. of soft plastics which were sent to a manufacturer of composite decking and outdoor furniture in Maine to be repurposed.

Every bit of plastic saved and collected helps protect all life and living on Earth.

Collection will follow COVID-Safe practices: Collectors will be wearing masks and socially distanced. Drop offs need to be done by "mask wearers".

The purpose of the Academy is not to teach the public how to be police officers, but to teach them about what we do in our community.

The students will be given classes on state laws, local ordinances and police policy and procedure. They will learn about special duty assignments and what it takes to become a police officer. The students will be given tours of Belknap County Jail, 911 Dispatch Center and the 4th Circuit District Division Laconia Court. The students will also have the opportunity to ride along with officers to get a firsthand glimpse of what it is like to work the streets of our community.

The Academy starts on September 15th and runs every Wednesday night from 6:00 to 9:00 pm until November 17th.

Deb has recently retired after 29 years in the fire and emergency medical services. Her most recent position was Fire Chief and Director of NH’s Fire and EMS Training Academy; the only career female Fire Chief in the State.

In retirement, Deb finds herself back at the Department of Safety working part time as the Mental Health Coordinator, following her passion to assist responders with mental wellness. In addition to being a certified firefighter, Executive Fire Officer and Advanced EMT, Deb holds a Bachelor’s Degree in Psychology and is trained in peer support and critical incident stress management. Deb has volunteered for the Granite State Critical Incident Stress Management team for 24 years as a peer support member. She has also presented training and education programs nationally to assist responders with understanding the effects of critical incident stress, compassion fatigue and learning about resilience.

Powerhouse Producer Bryan Halperin says “We couldn’t be more thrilled to welcome Deb to this event. Her background in firefighting and mental health for first responders is perfect to lend insight into our discussion. I’m excited to hear Deb’s perspective on the events in the play and their continued relevance today.”

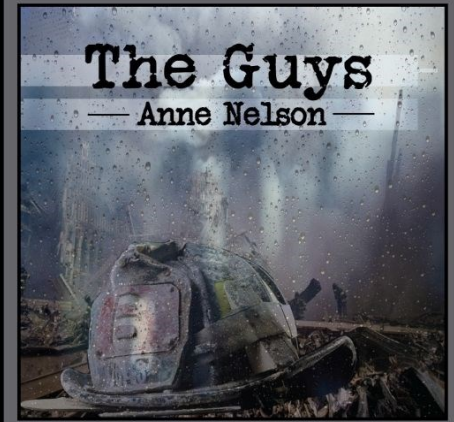
